Artist GOH Event Report

Tristan Alexander was drawing since he could hold a pencil. An art teacher once mentioned that he had mastered 'cirascuro', mastery over light and shadow. Alexander got into fantasy art because he was always into unicorns and fantasy beasts. His mate brought him to his first convention where people went ga-ga over his work.

Acrylics is his favorite medium but also likes pen and ink and mixed media. For published works he has done covers for Circlet Press and newsletters for the SCA (one of Alexander's biggest passions.) He has also published a couple of compilation books of his works.

He has painted on walls to rocks and likes painting on boxes. He switches back and forth from working in large scale and small scale. Sometimes seeing images in cracks of ceiling and wallpapers, etc. Sometimes those images will make it to his paintings.

Alexander's methods are somewhat opposite to what other people like. The traditional method is doing the background first then the detailed foreground. Alexander prefers to do the foreground first. He will outline sketches directly on the piece and then he goes over the image with water-proof marker then adds the paint. A piece can take any where from an hour to a couple of days.
